(UNDER SECTION 144 OF Cr. P.C.)

Counter Petitioner

Whereas, the Station House Officer, Palloor Police Station, has laid information against you in IR. No. 61/2019 under section 144 Cr. P.C. alleging that the Counter Petitioner is a permanent resident of the abovesaid address and an active worker of CPM Party. The Counter Petitioner is a habitual criminal and creating disturbance to public peace and tranquility by involving in the criminal activities and rowdism in the Village of Palloor and surrounding area. He is a mischief monger involved with action of violence and causing disturbance to the public peace and tranquility. The Counter Petitioner was involved in the following cases:

1. Cr.No. 121/16 under sections 143, 109 IPC & r/w 25 1 A Arms Act, 5 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908 r/w 149 IPC – Under Investigation.
2. Cr.No. 121/16 under section 3 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908, 435 IPC, r/w 34 IPC – Under Investigation.
3. Cr.No. 123/16 under sections 143, 147, 148, 447, 307, 435 IPC and 3 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908, r/w 149 IPC – Under Investigation.

The Station House Officer, Palloor, has also stated that there is reliable information that some hardcore criminals from neighbouring place of Kerala State are regularly visiting Palloor area to consume liquors. Moreover, there is reliable information that the Counter Petitioner has nexus with political criminals in Kerala area. The local Police is keeping close surveillance on the above Counter Petitioner. If, the Counter Petitioner is allowed in Palloor limit, it is apprehended that he will conspire with other political criminals to indulge in serious offences like assault, murder, explode country made bombs, criminal intimidation, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order.

And Whereas, the Station House Officer, Palloor Police Station, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 144 (i), (ii) and (iii) of Cr.P.C against you, not to enter into the jurisdiction of Subdivisional Magistrate Court to prevent danger to the human life and properties and to prevent disturbance to the public tranquility and order;

And whereas, you are summoned to this Court on 05-04-2019 at 3.30 p.m. and enquired on the cases registered against you and your depositions could not prove your innocence as you pleaded before this Court;

And whereas, based on the information laid before me, I am satisfied that there are sufficient grounds for proceeding against you under section 144 (i), (ii) and (iii) of Cr. P.C.;

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above, I, Aman Sharma, Subdivisional Magistrate, Mahe, in exercise of the powers conferred under Code of Criminal Procedure, do hereby prohibit you under section 144 of Cr. P.C from entering into the region under the control of my jurisdiction for a period of two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Mahe.
