This petition along with case sheet is filed by the Station House Officer, represented by Thiru Veerabathrasamy, Sub-Inspector, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, praying to pass orders under section 144 of Cr.P.C., against Thiru Nivash and Thiru Suriya to prevent imminent danger to human lives and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order, in the jurisdiction of this Court.

2. The Counter Petitioner No. 1 is Thiru Nivash (25), son of Yuvaraj, a resident of No. 144, Edayanchavady Road, Karuvadikuppam, Lawspet, Puducherry and the Counter Petitioner No. 2 is Thiru Suriya (26), son of Munusamy, a resident of No. 54, Annie Besant Nagar, Main Road, Navarkulam, Lawspet, Puducherry.

3. The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows: The case was referred by the Station House Officer, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, with the recommendation of the Superintendent of Police (North), Puducherry vide I.R.No. 77/2021 under section 144 of Cr.P.C., dated 10-06-2021. Therein, it has been stated that the Counter Petitioners have formed a gang of rowdies and bent upon indulging in crimes such as murder, violence, intimidation, assault, disturbance to the public tranquility and order. The Counter Petitioners have created panic in the minds of local inhabitants and the business people in the Lawspet Police Station limits, Puducherry. As a result, the people of Counter Petitioners do not come forward to lodge any complaint against them. It is also stated that even witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against them in the cases where they are the accused.

4. The Petitioner further submitted that the Counter Petitioners Thiru Nivash (25), and Thiru Suriya (26), had already been involved in the following criminal case in neighbouring Police Station of Puducherry.

1. Cr.No. 88/2019 under sections 120(b), 148, 341, 324, 307, 302, 109 IPC r/w 149 IPC and 3 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908 of Muthialpet Police Station, Puducherry – Pending Trial.

5. It is further stated in the I.R that the Counter Petitioners are young and very active notorious rowdy elements and have become a threat and menace to the innocent people and therefore, their criminal activities cannot be prevented by invoking the mere security proceedings under the Cr.P.C.

6. The Petitioner further submitted that if, the Counter Petitioners are allowed to reside in Puducherry limits, it is apprehended that they would continue to indulge in serious offences like assault, explodes country made bombs, criminal intimidation, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence, the Station House Officer, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 144 of Cr.P.C., against the Counter Petitioners do not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

7. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioners to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 24-06-2021 to appear for the hearing on 01-07-2021 at 11.00 a.m. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioners through the Station House Officer, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry. The notice for the Counter Petitioner Thiru Nivash, was received by his mother, Tmt. Manju. The notice for the Counter Petitioner Suriya was received by his father, Thiru K. Munusamy. The service was held sufficient for the Counter Petitioners.

8. On 01-07-2021, the Petitioner represented by Thiru Veerabathrasamy, Sub-Inspector, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, was present. The Counter Petitioners have failed to appear before the Court on hearing date.

9. I have heard the Petitioner and carefully gone through all the available records placed before me. In the Police Information Report/Petition, it is stated that the activities of Thiru Nivash and Thiru Suriya are in such a manner that they may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public tranquility. They had involved in crimes such as murder, assault, unlawful activities and disturbance to the public peace and order. There is one criminal case registered against them in Muthialpet Police Station, Puducherry.

10. On perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner and the recommendation of the Superintendent of Police (North), I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioners are allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioners will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, obstructions, annoyance, damages to public and private properties, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 144 of Cr.P.C., is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioners to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order;

Hence, I, M. Kandasamy, do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under the section 144(1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner No. 1 Thiru Nivash (25), son of Yuvaraj, a resident of No. 144, Edayanchavady Road, Karuvadikuppam, Lawspet, Puducherry and the Counter Petitioner No. 2 Thiru Suriya (26), son of Munusamy, a resident of No. 54, Annie Besant Nagar, Main Road, Navarkulam, Lawspet, Puducherry, from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except, when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, the Counter Petitioners may represent against this order before the undersigned by post or by Counsel.

It is also stated that even witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against them in ihe cases where they are the accused.

3. The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows: The case submitted by the Station House Officer, D'Nagar Police Station, Puducherry, through the Superintendent of Police (North), Puducherry vide I.R.No. 143/2021

under section 144 of Cr.P.C., dated 16-06-2021. Therein, it has been stated that the Counter Petitioner has formed a gang of rowdies and indulging in crime such as murder, attempt to murder, extortion by using lethal weapons. The Counter Petitioner has created panic in the minds of local inhabitants. It is also stated that he is extorting money from the local merchants and is leading lavish life with the money earned through extortion. As a result, the people of the locality being afraid of the Counter Petitioner do not come forward to lodge any complaint against him. It is also stated that even witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against him in the cases where he is the accused. In this connection, the Petitioner had stated that the following criminal cases were registered against the Counter Petitioner.

Hence, the Station House Officer, D'Nagar Police Station has prayed to invoke provisions under section 144 of Cr.P.C., against the Counter Petitioner do not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

2. The Counter Petitioner is Thiru Vicky @ Karuppu Vicky (26), son of Rajendiran, a resident of No. 06, Kamban Street, Kamaraj Nagar, Gorimedu, Puducherry. (Present address: No. 26, Karunajothi Street, Iluppa thoppu, Veeman Negar, Thilashpet, Puducherry).

3. The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows: The case submitted by the Station House Officer, D'Nagar Police Station through the Superintendent of Police (North), Puducherry vide I.R.No. 146/2021 under section 144 of Cr.P.C., dated 16-06-2021. Therein, it has been stated that the Counter Petitioner has formed a gang of rowdies and indulging in crime such as murder, attempt to murder, extortion by using lethal weapons. The Counter Petitioner has created panic in the minds of local inhabitants. It is also stated that he is extorting money from the local merchants and is leading lavish life with the money earned through extortion. As a result, the people of the locality being afraid of the Counter Petitioner do not come forward to lodge any complaint against him. It is also stated that the row witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against him in the cases where he is the accused. In this connection, the Petitioner.

It is also stated in the I.R that the Station House Officer has received reliable information that the Counter Petitioner along with his gang were planned for attacking his rival group to take revenge upon them. The Petitioner further stated that the Counter Petitioner has involved in various offences by using aruval, knife and explosive substances to attack the victims and become a source of terror among the public. It is also stated that the Counter Petitioner violated the conditions imposed by the Criminal Courts and have scant respect to the judiciary and rule of law.

5. The Petitioner further submitted that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in Puducherry urban limits, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like murder, extortion, assault, obstructions and annoyance, damages to public and private properties, and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence, the Station House Officer, D'Nagar Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 144 of Cr.P.C., against the Counter Petitioner do not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 24-06-2021 to appear for the hearing on 06-07-2021 at 11.00 a.m. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, D'Nagar Police Station, Puducherry. The notice for the Counter Petitioner was received by his brother, Thiru Raj. The service was held sufficient for the Counter Petitioner.

7. On 06-07-2021 at 11.00 a.m. the Petitioner represented by Thiru Ganapathy, Assistant Sub-Inspector, D'Nagar Police Station, Puducherry, was present. The Counter Petitioner has failed to appear before the Court on hearing date.

8. I have heard the Petitioner and carefully gone through all the available records placed before me. In the Police Information Report/Petition, it is stated that the activities of Thiru Vicky @ Karuppu Vicky, is in such a manner that he may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public tranquility. He has involved in crimes such as murder, unlawful activities and disturbance to the public peace and order. There are 2 criminal cases were registered against him in D'Nagar Police Station, Puducherry.

9. On perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner and the recommendation of the Superintendent of Police (North), I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, damages to public and private properties, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 144 of Cr.P.C., is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order.

Hence, I, M. Kandasamy, do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under the section 144(1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Vicky @ Karuppu Vicky (26), son of Rajendiran, a resident of No. 06, Kamban Street, Kamaraj Nagar, Gorimedu, Puducherry. (Present address: No. 26, Karunajothi Street, Iluppa Thoppu, Veeman Nagar, Thilashpet, Puducherry), from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, the Counter Petitioner may represent against this order before the undersigned by post or by Counsel.
