NOTIFICATION

The Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (Sagarmala Cell), Government of India *vide* their communication Letter No. M-25021/14/2024-SM (e-365466), dated 22-04-2024 of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways (Sagarmala Cell), Government of India, has requested all Coastal/Non-Coastal States to constitute the "State Maritime and Waterways Transport Committee (SMWTC)" for their respective States/Union Territories to monitor and implement various initiatives pertaining to the Maritime and Waterways Sector.

- 2. Accordingly, the Hon'ble Lieutenant-Governor, Puducherry, is pleased to constitute the "State Maritime and Waterways Transport Committee (SMWTC)" for the Union territory of Puducherry with the following composition;
 - (i) Commissioner-cum-Secretary to ... Chairperson Government (Ports), Puducherry
 - (ii) Director of Ports, Puducherry .. Member-Convener
 - (iii) Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, ... Member Puducherry
 - (iv) Transport Commissioner, Puducherry . . Member
 - (v) Director of Tourism, Puducherry .. Member
 - (vi) Director of Fisheries, Puducherry .. Member
 - (vii) Representative from Railways, ... Member Tiruchirapalli Division.
 - (viii) Representative from Regional Office, . . Member NHAI, Chennai.
 - (ix) Assistant Commissioner of Customs, ... Member Cuddalore.
 - (x) Representative from Directorate-General . . Member of Lighthouse and Lightships, Chennai.
 - (xi) Representative from Mercantile Marine ... Member Department, Chennai.
- 3. The objectives of the "State Maritime and Waterways Transport Committee (SMWTC)" for the Union territory of Puducherry is as hereunder;
- (i) To facilitate close coordination between Central and State Agencies to resolve issues relating to projects on Maritime/Waterways Sector inclusive of Sea and River based tourism activities.
- (ii) Unlock the full potential of the Union Territories Maritime/Waterways resources through diligent monitoring and proactive intervention.
- (iii) Pave the way for a brighter and more prosperous future for coastal and river communities and the Nation as a whole.
- 4. The broad Terms of Reference (ToR) for the State Maritime and Waterways Transport Committee is enclosed as Annexure 1.
 - 5. The Committee shall meet once in Three months.

ANNEXURE 1

TERMS OF REFERENCES (ToR)

The broad Terms of Reference for the State Maritime and Waterway Transport Committees are given below:

These ToRs aim to guide the Committees in addressing critical aspects of the maritime sector in the State, promoting sustainable development and contributing to the overall economic growth and well-being of the State.

- I. Maritime and Waterways Master Plan: (a) Preparation of a State specific Maritime and Waterways Transport Master Plan. The Master Plan may have components such as Waterways development, Inland and Coastal Berths and Terminals, Skill Development, Urban Water Transportation, cruise/river cruise, Passenger/RoRo and RoPAx ferries, Seaplane services, Floating Jetties, Fishing Harbours, etc. It may be noted that MoPSW had already requested Maritime Boards of coastal States to prepare a Maritime Master Plan. SMWTCs can coordinate and ensure incorporation of waterways development plan also in the Master Plan, and the same to be prepared for non-coastal States having waterways also. SMWTCs will oversee the preparation and subsequent implementation of the Master Plan of the State.
- (b) Establish clear timelines, milestones and performance indicators to track progress and ensure accountability.
- (c) Regularly review and update the Maritime and Waterways Master Plan based on evolving priorities, emerging challenges and feedback from stakeholders.
- II. Monitoring Implementation of Projects and Schemes: (a) Monitor the implementation of the initiatives and projects as outlined in the Maritime Master Plan, and other MoPSW sponsored Schemes and projects/initiatives, such as Sagarmala, within the State.
- (b) Allocate resources and establish project teams or task forces to oversee the execution of each project.
- (c) Monitor project progress regularly and address any issues or bottlenecks to ensure timely completion.
- (d) Foster collaboration with relevant Government agencies, Private sector partners, and international organizations to leverage expertise and resources for project implementation.
- III. Achievement Assessment: (a) Define Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and benchmarks to measure the success of implemented initiatives and projects.
- (b) Conduct regular assessments to evaluate the effectiveness of implemented initiatives in achieving their intended outcomes.
- (c) Solicit feedback from stakeholders and incorporate lessons learned into future planning and implementation efforts.
- (d) Prepare reports summarizing achievements, challenges, and recommendations for improvement.

- IV. Maritime Sector Policies: (a) Conduct reviews of existing maritime sector policies in the State to identify gaps and areas for improvement.
- (b) Help in formulating new policies or amend existing ones to ensure that policies promote sustainable development, safety, security, and competitiveness within the maritime sector, thereby improving the maritime ecosystem.
- (c) Consult with industry stakeholders, legal experts, and regulatory agencies to ensure policy coherence and effectiveness.
- V. Output/Outcome Evaluation of Maritime and Waterway Initiatives: (a) Evaluate the outputs and outcomes of maritime initiatives within the State. Establish performance metrics aligned with the objectives of each initiative to measure effectiveness and impact.
- (b) Collect relevant data and conduct regular assessments to track progress and identify areas for improvement.
- (c) Engage with stakeholders to gather feedback and insights on the perceived value and impact of implemented initiatives.
- (d) Use evaluation findings to inform decision-making, allocate resources efficiently, and optimize future implementation efforts.
- VI. Security, Safety and Disaster Management: (a) Strengthen maritime/waterway security infrastructure, including surveillance systems, patrol vessels, and port security measures within the State
- (b) Ensure Statutory Compliances such as ISPS, NSPC, POL, Security, Customs, Pollution, etc., for all ports and terminals in the State.
- (c) Develop and implement contingency plans for various maritime emergencies, including oil spills, natural disasters and security threats.
- VII. Green Initiatives: (a) Promote the adoption of eco-friendly technologies and practices across the sector in the State, including vessel emissions controls, alternative fuels and waste management solutions.
- (b) Implement regulations and standards to enforce compliance with environmental laws and promote sustainability in maritime operations.
- (c) Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of green initiatives and adjust strategies as needed to achieve desired environmental outcomes.
- VIII. Waterways Development: (a) Assess the existing waterway infrastructure and potential for development within the state in collaboration with IWAI.
- (b) Formulate a detailed Waterways Development Plan, outlining short-term and long-term objectives (with special focus on Cargo, Passengers, River and Cruise Tourism), prioritized projects, and resource allocation in collaboration with IWAI.
- (c) Monitor the progress of waterway development initiatives, track KPIs, and conduct periodic evaluations to identify challenges and opportunities for improvement.

- (d) Engage in proactive communication and outreach efforts to garner support from stakeholders and the general public.
- (e) Continuously explore innovative solutions and best practices in waterway management and development, seeking to optimize efficiency, safety and environmental stewardship.
- IX. Cruise Tourism (Ocean/River): (a) Develop infrastructure and facilities to support the growth of cruise tourism within the State.
- (b) Improve accessibility and connectivity of ports and terminals to accommodate the Vessels.
- (c) Enhance the quality of services and amenities available to passengers and ferry commuters, including terminal facilities, transportation options and tourism options.
- (d) Collaborate with tourism operators, private operators and local communities to promote and market cruise services effectively.
- X. Urban Water Transportation (Ferries/Ro-ro/Ro-Pax): (a) Develop infrastructure and facilities to support the growth of ferry services, and urban water transportation within the State.
- (b) Improve accessibility and connectivity of ports and terminals to accommodate the Vessels.
- (c) Enhance the quality of services and amenities available to passengers and ferry commuters, including terminal facilities, transportation options.
- (d) Collaborate with private operators and local communities to promote and market ferry services effectively.
- XI. Development of Lighthouses: (a) Promote tourism at lighthouses and conserve heritage structures while offering a unique lighthouse-based tourism experience.
- (b) Compile and analyse data related to lighthouses, heritage conservation, tourism potential, tourism footfall, etc.
- XII. Cargo Traffic: Maintain and compile data related to cargo traffic for all ports within the State, monthly, quarterly, yearly, etc., both coastal and EXIM, including Cargo Traffic for different commodities.
