3. *The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows:* The case submitted by the Station House Officer, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry, through the Superintendent of Police (East), Puducherry *vide* I.R.No. 13/2026 under section 163 of BNSS, dated 19-02-2026. Therein it has been stated that the Counter Petitioner has formed a gang of rowdies and indulging in crimes such as murder and disturbance to the public tranquility and order. It is also stated that the Counter Petitioner has created panic in the minds of local inhabitants and the business community in Puducherry and is leading lavish life with the money earned through extortion. As a result, the people of the locality being afraid of the Counter Petitioner do not come forward to lodge any complaint against him. It is also stated that even witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against him. In this connection, the Petitioner had stated that the following criminal case was registered against the Counter Petitioner.

1. Cr.No. 37/2025 under sections 191(2), 191(3), 140(1), 127(2), 118(1), 103(2), 49 BNS r/w 190 BNS, dated 14-02-2025, Grand Bazaar Police Station, Puducherry.

4. The Petitioner further submitted that the Counter Petitioner is a notorious rowdy element. It is also stated in the I.R that the Counter Petitioner is desperate and is in dire need of money to maintain his group of rowdy elements and legal expenses. He is hatching plans to threaten the business people and extort money from them by threatening. It is further stated that the Counter Petitioner violated the conditions imposed by the Criminal Court. It is further submitted that the Counter Petitioner's presence during the upcoming elections could trigger a major law and order crisis. The Petitioner also stated that the Counter Petitioner earned displeasure among a section of other rowdy group in the area on account of the grudge against him and hence, rival group is also waiting opportunity to take revenge upon him.

5. The Petitioner further submitted that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in Orleanpet Police Station limits, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like riot, extortion and damages to public and private properties *etc.*, and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence, the Station House Officer, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS against the Counter Petitioner do not to enter into the Puducherry region for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 18-03-2026 to appear for the hearing on 24-03-2026 and subsequent hearing on 30-03-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry. The notice for the Counter Petitioner was received by his mother Tmt. A. Latha. The service was held sufficient for the Counter Petitioner.

7. On 30-03-2026, the Petitioner represented by Thiru V. Govindane, Sub-Inspector of Police, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry was present. The Counter Petitioner has failed to appear before the Court on hearing date.

8. I have heard the Petitioner and carefully gone through all the available records placed before me. In the Police Information Report / Petition, it is stated that the activities of the Counter Petitioner are in such a manner that he may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public tranquility. There is one criminal case registered against him in Grand Bazaar Police Station.

9. On perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner, I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, damages to public and private properties, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order.

10. Hence, I, Dayanand Tendolkar, do hereby in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of the powers conferred under the section 163(1) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Vishnu, son of Arumugam, Ambedkar Nagar, Attupatti, Puducherry, from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of one month from the date of this order (in view of GEPLA - 2026) or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry.

The Petitioner also stated that the Counter Petitioner earned displeasure among a section of other rowdy group in the area on account of the grudge against him and hence, rival group is also waiting opportunity to take revenge upon him.

5. The Petitioner further submitted that if the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in Orleanpet Police Station limits, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like riot, affray, criminal intimidation, trespass, assault and damages to public and private propertis etc and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence,, the Station House Officer, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS against the Counter Petitioner do not to enter into the Puducherry region for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 18-03-2026 to appear for the hearing on 24-03-2026 and subsequent hearing on 30-03-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry. The notice was received by the Counter Petitioner.

7. On 30-03-2026, the Petitioner represented by Thiru V. Govindane, Sub-Inspector of Police, Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry was present. The Counter Petitioner has failed to appear before the Court on hearing date.

8. I have heard the Petitioner and carefully gone through all the available records placed before me. In the Police information Report / Petition, it is stated that the activities of the Counter Petitioner are in such a manner that he may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public tranquility. There are various criminal cases registered against him in Orleanpet Police Station, Puducherry.

9. On perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner, I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, damages to public and private properties, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order.

10. Hence, I, Dayanand Tendolkar, do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of the powers conferred under the section 163(1) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Aravindh @ Chinna Aravindh (22), son of Jean Michel Denial Saintilare, No. 08, 8th Cross, Murugan Koil back side, Periyar Nagar, Nellithope, Puducherry, from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of one month from the date of this order (in view of GEPLA - 2026) or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry.

At Puducherry, dated on this 30th day of March, 2026 pronounced in the open Court.
