Whereas, the Station House Officer, Thirubuvanai Police Station, Puducherry, has laid credible information before this Court in I.R. No. 04/2026, dated 05-02-2026 under section 163 BNSS, 2023, seeking initiation of preventive proceedings and requesting issuance of orders under section 163(3) of BNSS to restrain you from entering into the Puducherry South region within the jurisdiction of this Court;

And whereas, it is revealed from the records that you have a longstanding criminal antecedent history involving repeated commission of offences affecting public order, the particulars of which are detailed hereunder:

And whereas, the above cases clearly establish that you are a habitual offender, repeatedly involved in both substantive criminal offences and preventive proceedings, demonstrating a consistent pattern of conduct prejudicial to public peace and order;

And whereas, you have appeared before this Court on 20-02-2026, 26-02-2026, 05-03-2026 and 12-03-2026, and despite being afforded sufficient opportunity, no satisfactory explanation has been offered to dispel the serious allegations against you;

And whereas, the Station House Officer has reported that you are functioning as a labour contractor and are misusing such position to threaten industrialists and business persons, and are also habitually engaging in gambling activities, thereby adversely affecting lawful business operations and public order;

And whereas, credible inputs further disclose that you are indulging in intimidation and extortion by extracting money from business establishments under threat, thereby creating an atmosphere of fear and insecurity among the public;

And whereas, it is specifically reported that the counter petitioner is maintaining association with rival groups and harbouring enmity, and is likely to engage in retaliatory violent acts, which may lead to serious breach of peace, disturbance to public tranquility and danger to human life, and property;

And whereas, such unlawful activities have created a fear psychosis among the residents and traders in Madagadipet and adjoining areas, resulting in reluctance on the part of victims and witnesses to come forward to lodge complaints or give evidence;

And whereas, the interim report of the Station House Officer further reveals that you have recently threatened a contesting candidate and former MLA of the constituency, thereby escalating tensions and creating a situation likely to lead to breach of peace;

And whereas, this Court is satisfied that your continued presence within the jurisdiction poses a grave and imminent threat to public peace and that immediate preventive action is warranted. Further, this Court is further satisfied that externment is necessary, proportionate and the only effective measure to prevent further unlawful activities;

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above I, A. Kumaran, Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under Code of Criminal Procedure, do hereby prohibit you under section 163(3) of BNSS from entering into the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (South), jurisdiction for one month from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, you may appear either in person or by Pleader before the undersigned to represent against the order.

And whereas, the above cases clearly establish that you are a habitual offender, repeatedly involved in both substantive criminal offences and preventive proceedings, demonstrating a consistent pattern of conduct prejudicial to public peace and order;

And whereas, the above cases clearly establish that you are a habitual offender, repeatedly involved in both substantive criminal offences and preventive proceedings, demonstrating a consistent pattern of conduct prejudicial to public peace and order;

And whereas, summon was served for your appearance on 01-04-2026 to file your explanation / objection as to why the Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Villianur, Puducherry, should not order to prevent you from entering into the south region under section 163(3) of BNSS.

And whereas, the petitioner appeared before this Court, the explanation offered by you is unsatisfactory, devoid of merit and fails to dispel the apprehension of breach of peace, and is therefore rejected;

And whereas, upon careful consideration of the report submitted by the Station House Officer, the materials placed on record, your past antecedents, and the prevailing law and order situation in the jurisdiction, this Court is satisfied that your continued presence within the said limits poses a real, imminent and grav threat to the maintenance of public peace, tranquility, safety of persons and protection of property;

And whereas, this Court also takes into account the impending conduct of General Elections to Puducherry Legislative Assembly, which necessitates the maintenance of a free, fair and peaceful electoral environment, and any act of intimidation, coercion, undue influence, or disturbance of public order would seriously prejudice the democratic process;

And whereas, it is further observed that the presence and activities attributed to you are likely to create fear and insecurity among the general public and voters, thereby adversely affecting the smooth and orderly conduct of the election process;

And whereas, this Court is further satisfied that lesser preventive measures would not suffice and that temporary externment from the jurisdiction is necessary to neutralize imminent threat and to restore confidence among the general public;

And whereas, based on the report laid before me, I am of the opinion that presence of the petitioner within the South Jurisdiction is likely to result in further threat to his life as well as disturbance to public peace and order. Hence, such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against you to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order. And whereas, during the course of enquiry, it has come to the notice of this Court, based on credible intelligence inputs furnished by the Station House Officer, that there exists a real and imminent likelihood that he would resume his violent activities, indulge in acts of retaliation, criminal intimidation and murder, thereby posing a grave threat to public order and tranquility;

And whereas, it is also reported that due to longstanding enmity between rival groups, the life of the Counter Petitioner himself is under constant threat, and his presence in the jurisdiction would likely result in retaliatory violence, chain crimes and breach of peace affecting the general public;

And whereas, in view of the non-appearance of the Counter Petitioner, the urgency of the situation, the gravity of the offences involved and the imminent danger to public peace and safety, this Court is constrained to proceed *ex parte* under section 163(2) of BNSS, 2023;

And whereas, upon receipt of the said Information Report, this Court took cognizance of the matter and issued summons to the counter petitioner, and in compliance thereof, the counter petitioner appeared before this Court on 01-04-2026, and he was informed of the substance of the allegations and afforded reasonable opportunity to put forth his explanation;

And whereas, after hearing the counter petitioner and on careful perusal of the materials placed on record, including the report of the Station House Officer and connected case records, it is revealed that the counter petitioner is a notorious and habitual offender, widely known in the locality as a rowdy element, whose conduct and activities are consistently prejudicial to the maintenance of public peace, law and order;

And whereas, the materials disclose that the counter petitioner has organized and is operating along with a group of anti-social elements, forming a gang that indulges in unlawful acts such as assault, extortion, criminal intimidation, rioting, obstruction and disturbance to public tranquility, thereby instilling fear among the residents and business community of Kirumampakkam and adjoining areas;

And whereas, it is further borne out from the records that the counter petitioner is involved in a series of grave criminal cases of serious nature, including offences punishable for murder, attempt to murder, unlawful assembly, use of deadly weapons, and offences under special enactments such as the Explosive Substances Act, 1908 and the Arms Act, 1959, which clearly establish his propensity towards violence and habitual engagement in criminal conduct;

And whereas, it is also evident that despite his arrest and remand in earlier cases, and subsequent release on bail by Competent Courts, the counter petitioner has not reformed his conduct, but on the contrary, has continued to indulge in criminal activities, thereby demonstrating blatant disregard for the rule of law and authority of the Courts;

And whereas, it is specifically submitted that the counter petitioner along with his associates, acting in furtherance of their common intention, criminally trespassed into the residence of one George Fernandes (veech aruval) and assaulted him with deadly weapons and attempted to commit his murder, resulting in registration of a case in Cr.No. 39/2025 under relevant provisions of BNS, 2023, thereby evidencing his readiness to resort to extreme violence;

And whereas, during enquiry it has come to light that the counter petitioner continues to harbour deep-seated enmity and vengeance against the said George Fernandes and is allegedly making preparations to eliminate him, which gives rise to a real, imminent and grave threat to human life;

And whereas, credible information received reveals that the counter petitioner engaged in quarrels with members of the public, particularly local youths, and openly threatened them thereby asserting unlawful dominance and creating an atmosphere of fear, intimidation and insecurity in the locality;

And whereas, it is pertinent to note that upon Police intervention, the counter petitioner fled from the scene, and no members of the public came forward to lodge complaint or give statements, which is not due to absence of offence but is clearly attributable to the fear psychosis and intimidation created by the counter petitioner, resulting in reluctance of witnesses to cooperate with law enforcement authorities;

And whereas, the materials further reveal that witnesses and residents of the locality are under constant fear of retaliation, and hence, refrain from coming forward to depose against the counter petitioner, thereby enabling him to operate with impunity and undermining the normal criminal justice process;

And whereas, on a cumulative assessment of the entire materials placed before this Court, it is evident that the acts of the counter petitioner are not isolated or stray incidents, but form part of a continuous course of conduct demonstrating a persistent criminal tendency and a threat to societal peace and order;

And whereas, this Court is satisfied that the continued presence of the counter petitioner within the jurisdiction of Kirumampakkam Police Station and adjoining areas is highly prejudicial to the maintenance of public peace and tranquility, and poses a serious and imminent danger to the life and property of the general public;

And whereas, this Court is further satisfied that the situation cannot be effectively dealt with by resorting to ordinary legal procedures, particularly in view of the failure of earlier preventive measures and the prevailing atmosphere of fear which prevents witnesses from coming forward;

And whereas, this Court, having duly considered the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of allegations, the antecedents of the counter petitioner, and the likelihood of continuation of such activities, is of the considered opinion that immediate preventive action is absolutely necessary to prevent escalation of violence and to maintain public order;

And whereas, this Court is therefore satisfied that the invocation of powers under section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 is justified and warranted in the present case to prevent imminent danger to human life, property and public tranquility;

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above I, A. Kumaran, Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under Code of Criminal Procedure, do hereby prohibit you under section 163(3) of BNSS from entering into the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (South), jurisdiction for two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, you may appear either in person or by Pleader before the undersigned to represent against the order.
