This petition along with case sheet is filed by the Sub-Inspector of Police, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, praying to pass orders under section 163 BNSS against the Counter Petitioner to prevent imminent danger to human lives and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order, in the jurisdiction of this Court.

2. The Counter Petitioner is Thiru Pandiyan Balaji (26), son of Shanmugam, a resident of No. 01, Kamar Street, Samipillaihattam, Lawspet, Puducherry.

3. *The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows:* The case was referred by the Sub-Inspector of Police, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, with the recommendation of the Superintendent of Police (North), Puducherry *vide* I.R.No.106/2025 under section 163 BNSS, dated 27-10-2025.

4. Therein, it has been stated that the Counter Petitioner have formed a gang of rowdies and bent upon indulging in crimes such as violence, intimidation, assault, disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

5. The Counter Petitioner has created panic in the minds of local inhabitants and the business people in the Lawspet Police Station limits. As a result the people of the locality being afraid of the Counter Petitioner do not come forward to lodge any complaint against him. It is also stated that even witnesses don't come forward voluntarily to give evidence against him. In this connection, the Petitioner had stated that the following criminal case was registered against the Counter Petitioner.

Cr.No. 76/2025 under sections 191 (2), 191 (3), 103 (1), 109 (1) BNS r/w 190 BNS @ 191 (2), 191 (3), 49, 103 (1), 109 (1), 61, 49, 238 BNS r/w 190 BNS, dated 27-04-2025 of Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry.

6. It is further stated in the I.R that the Counter Petitioner is young and very active notorious rowdy element and have become a threat and menace to the innocent people and therefore his criminal activities cannot be prevented by invoking the mere security proceedings under the BNSS.

7. The Petitioner further submitted that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in Lawspet limits, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like assault, explodes country made bombs, criminal intimidation, obstructions, annoyance *etc.*, and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence, the Sub-Inspector of Police, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS against the Counter Petitioner to not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of three months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

8. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 02-02-2026 to appear for the hearing on 04-02-2026 at 10.00 a.m. and further hearings held on 06-02-2026 and 09-02-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry. The notice for the Counter Petitioner was received by his relative. The Service was held sufficient for the Counter Petitioner.

9. During the course of enquiry on 04-02-2026 and 09-02-2026, the Petitioner, Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry, was present. The Counter Petitioner has failed to appear before the Court on hearing dates.

10. I have heard the Petitioner and carefully gone through all the available records placed before me. In the Police Information Report/Petition, it is stated that the activities of the Counter Petitioner in such a manner that he may cause

breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public tranquility. He was involved in crimes such as murder, assault, unlawful activities and disturbance to the public peace and order. There is one criminal case was registered against him in Lawspet Police Station, Puducherry.

11. On perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner and the recommendation of the Superintendent of Police (North), I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, obstructions, annoyance, damages to public and private properties, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order;

Hence, I, Ishita Rathi, I.A.S., do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under section 163(1) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Pandiyan Balaji (26), son of Shanmugam, a resident of No. 01, Kambar Street, Samipillaithottam, Lawspet, Puducherry from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North) for a period of two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except, when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry.
