ORDER

[UNDER SECTION 163(3) BNSS, 2023]

To

Whereas, information has been laid before this Court by the Station House Officer, Thirukkanur Police Station, Puducherry, in I.R. No. 03/2026 under section 163 BNSS, stating that you are a notorious rowdy history sheet holder within Thirukkanur Police Station limits and are habitually involved in offences affecting public tranquility, offences against human body and property, and that your continued presence in Kunichampet Village and surrounding areas is causing fear, panic and disturbance to the peaceful life of the residents;

And whereas, it is reported that Kunichampet Village comprises around 500 families belonging to various communities and that the general public, agriculturists and daily wage earners residing therein are living under constant fear on account of your repeated involvement in criminal activities;

And whereas, on perusal of the police records, you are found involved in the following cases:

And whereas, records reveal your involvement in several criminal cases, including offences punishable under sections 324, 323, 506(ii), 307 IPC, provisions of the Arms Act, PDPP Act, COTPA Act, and provisions of BNS, and that in certain cases you were convicted and underwent imprisonment and were released on 20-12-2024 after completion of conviction period;

And whereas, subsequent to your release, you have again involved yourself in criminal activities, including possession of deadly weapons, intimidation of the general public, public nuisance, and other acts prejudicial to maintenance of public peace and order, and fresh cases including Cr.No. 62/2025 and Cr.No. 23/2026 have been registered against you by Thirukkanur Police Station, Puducherry;

And whereas, the Station House Officer has specifically reported that:

- You threaten general public and passers-by with deadly weapons such as knife (aruval);
- You violate bail conditions and show scant respect to the rule of law;
- Witnesses are unwilling to come forward due to fear of retaliation;

- Your activities are likely to result in serious offences including assault, attempt to murder and disturbance to public tranquility;
- Ordinary preventive measures are insufficient to curb your activities;

And whereas, on receipt of the said report, this Court registered MC No. 28/2026 and issued summons directing you to appear before this Court on 20-02-2026 to show cause as to why an order under section 163(3) of BNSS should not be passed restraining you from entering into the jurisdiction of Subdivisional Magistrate (South);

And whereas, you failed to appear before this Court on 20-02-2026, nor did you file any explanation or objection. There is no representation on your behalf. Your non-appearance shows disregard to the process of law and lack of intention to submit to lawful authority;

And whereas, in view of your failure to appear despite service of summons, and considering the urgency of the matter relating to maintenance of public peace and order, this Court proceeds to decide the matter *ex parte* under section 163(2) of BNSS, 2023 in the view of urgency of the matter;

And whereas, upon careful perusal of:

- The detailed report of the Station House Officer,
- The list of criminal antecedents,
- The recent involvement in criminal cases even after release from imprisonment,
- The apprehension expressed by the police regarding imminent breach of peace,

I am satisfied that your continued presence within the jurisdiction of Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, poses a real and imminent threat to public tranquility, safety of persons and protection of property.

And whereas, I am further satisfied that:

- Your criminal conduct is habitual in nature;
- You have scant respect for judicial process;
- Preventive measures under ordinary law have proved ineffective;
- There exists sufficient material to conclude that immediate preventive action is necessary to avert danger to life and property;

and that invoking the special preventive jurisdiction under section 163 of BNSS is essential to uphold public peace and order.

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above I, A. Kumaran, Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry in exercise of powers conferred under Code of Criminal Procedure do hereby prohibit you under section 163(3) of BNSS from entering into the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (South), Jurisdiction for two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, you may appear either in person or by pleader before the undersigned to represent against the order.
