Whereas, information has been laid before this Court by the Station House Officer, Villianur Police Station, Puducherry, in I.R. No. 111/2025 under section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, stating that you have trivial and scant respect to the judiciary and rule of law and you are a notorious rowdy, history-sheeted offender and habitual criminal operating within Villianur Police Station limits and adjoining areas;

And whereas, it is reported that you have formed and are actively leading a gang of anti-social elements, and are harbouring and influencing young persons towards criminal activities, thereby spreading unlawful tendencies in the locality. Further, your continued activities have created an atmosphere of fear, panic and insecurity among the general public, and law-abiding citizens are unable to carry on their normal avocations peacefully.

And whereas, it has been specifically stated that due to the counter petitioner's criminal antecedents and violent background, the general public is under constant fear and is unwilling to come forward to lodge complaints against him, apprehending retaliation and harm to their life and property;

And whereas, on perusal of Police records, you are found involved in the following criminal cases:

And whereas, the above cases disclose your continuous involvement in grave and heinous offences, including offences punishable for murder, rioting with deadly weapons, criminal intimidation and assault, thereby establishing your propensity for violence and disregard for rule of law;

And whereas, the Station House Officer has reported that:

- You are habitually associating with anti-social elements and instigating criminal activities;
- You intimidate and threaten the public, preventing them from approaching authorities;
- A climate of fear and silence prevails due to your activities;
- Your conduct is prejudicial to public order and tranquility;
- There exists a strong and imminent likelihood of breach of peace;
- Ordinary preventive measures have proved ineffective;

And whereas, this Court issued summons to you on 20-01-2026 and 03-02-2026 affording sufficient opportunity to appear and show cause;

And whereas, you appeared before this Court and were heard on 20-01-2026 and 03-02-2026 however, the explanation offered by you is unsatisfactory, devoid of merit and fails to dispel the apprehension of breach of peace, and is therefore rejected;

And whereas, upon careful consideration of the report, your antecedents and the prevailing situation, this Court is satisfied that your continued presence poses a real and imminent threat to public peace, safety of persons and protection of property;

And whereas, this Court is further satisfied that lesser preventive measures would not suffice and that temporary externment from the jurisdiction is necessary to neutralize imminent threat and to restore confidence among the general public;

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above, I, A. Kumaran, Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under law, do hereby prohibit you under section 163(3) of BNSS from entering into the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, for a period of two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition, whichever is earlier, except when you are required to attend any Court proceedings within Puducherry. However, you may appear either in person or by Pleader before the undersigned to make representation against this order.

Whereas, information has been laid before this Court by the Station House Officer, Villianur Police Station, Puducherry *vide* I.R. No. 146/2025 under section 163 of BNSS, 2023, bringing to notice that the counter petitioner herein is a habitual offender whose continuous unlawful activities are prejudicial to the maintenance of public peace, tranquility and law and order within the jurisdiction of this Court;

And whereas, it is reported that the counter petitioner is not an isolated offender but, a habitual and hardened criminal, who has consistently engaged himself in offences involving violence, intimidation, illicit drug trafficking, unlawful assembly and use of deadly weapons, thereby posing a grave and continuing threat to Society;

And whereas, the materials placed before this Court disclose that counter petitioner has been involved in a series of criminal cases spanning several years, clearly establishing a pattern of criminal conduct and disregard for law, as detailed hereunder:

And whereas, a careful perusal of the above cases reveals that the counter petitioner has been involved in serious offences including attempt to murder (Sec. 307 IPC), rioting with deadly weapons, NDPS offences relating to possession and distribution of narcotic substances, Arms Act violations, criminal intimidation and assault, thereby establishing that his activities are not sporadic but, systematic and habitual in nature;

And whereas, it is further reported that the counter petitioner has formed and is actively operating a gang of anti-social elements, and is instrumental in harbouring, influencing and motivating young persons to engage in criminal activities, including acts of violence and illicit drug distribution, thereby contributing to the deterioration of public order and safety;

And whereas, credible and reliable intelligence inputs indicate that the counter petitioner is actively involved in threatening business persons, extracting money by intimidation (extortion) and creating an atmosphere of fear and panic among the residents and traders, particularly in the rural limits of Villianur and adjoining areas;

And whereas, it is also brought to the notice of this Court that due to the fear psychosis created by the counter petitioner, the general public and victims are reluctant to come forward to lodge complaints or depose against him, resulting in weakening of prosecution cases and enabling him to continue his unlawful activities with impunity;

And whereas, the records further indicate that though the counter petitioner has been arrested in several cases, he has managed to secure bail and thereafter continues to indulge in criminal activities, thereby demonstrating a complete lack of respect for the rule of law and judicial processes;

And whereas, it is pertinent to note that the counter petitioner has also been subjected to preventive actions in the past under Cr.P.C. provisions and has even been detained twice under the PIT NDPS Act, which clearly establishes his persistent involvement in illicit drug-related activities and his failure to reform despite stringent legal measures;

And whereas, it is specifically reported that the counter petitioner is maintaining association with rival groups and harbouring enmity and is likely to engage in retaliatory violent acts, which may lead to serious breach of peace, disturbance to public tranquility and danger to human life, and property;

And whereas, summons in this case was duly served on the counter petitioner on 20-01-2026, affording him an opportunity of being heard; however, he has failed to appear before this Court, thereby exhibiting willful disobedience and disregard for lawful authority, compelling this Court to proceed *ex parte* in view of the urgency involved;

And whereas, upon an independent, objective and careful consideration of the entire materials placed on record, including the antecedents of the counter petitioner, the nature and gravity of offences, the report of the Station House Officer, and the prevailing ground situation, this Court is satisfied that:

- the counter petitioner is a habitual offender;
- his activities pose a real, imminent and continuing threat to public peace and tranquility;
- there exists a likelihood of escalation into serious violence and law and order disturbance;
- the situation is of such urgency that it cannot be effectively prevented by resorting to ordinary legal remedies;

And whereas, this Court is of the considered opinion that immediate preventive action is warranted to neutralize the threat posed by the counter petitioner and to safeguard public peace, life and property;

Now, therefore, based on the reasons stated above I, A. Kumaran, Subdivisional Magistrate (South), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under Code of Criminal Procedure, do hereby prohibit you under section 163(3) of BNSS from entering into the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (South), Jurisdiction for two months from the date of this order or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry. However, you may appear either in person or by Pleader before the undersigned to represent against the order.
