3. *The facts which led up to the petition are briefly as follows:* The case submitted by the Station House Officer, Odiansalai Police Station, Puducherry, through the Superintendent of Police (East), Puducherry *vide* I.R.No. 10/2026 under section 163 of BNSS, dated 05-02-2026. Therein, it has been stated that the Counter Petitioner has indulging in crime such as disturbance to the public tranquility and order. The Petitioner has also submitted that Counter Petitioner is a young and energetic rowdy element and shows his muscle power by committing offences for petty reasons. As a result, the people of the locality being afraid of the Counter Petitioner do not come forward to lodge any complaint against him. He is very active and may disturb the public peace and tranquility in the forthcoming Assembly Elections and therefore, his criminal activities cannot be prevented by invoking the mere security proceedings under the BNSS. In this connection, the Petitioner had stated that the following criminal cases were registered against the Counter Petitioner.

4. It is also stated in the I.R that the Counter Petitioner is having close contact with other rowdy elements. The Petitioner also stated that the Counter Petitioner earned displeasure among a section of other rowdy group in the area on account of the grudge against him and hence, rival group is also waiting opportunity to take revenge upon him which may cause breach of peace and public tranquility in KD Thottam. It is also stated that the Counter Petitioner along with his friends under drunken mood, designed to commit some cognizable offence at KD Thottam, Puducherry. It is further stated that the Counter Petitioner violated the conditions imposed by the Criminal Courts.

5. The Petitioner further submitted that if the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in the village, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like riot, affray, criminal intimidation, criminal trespass, assault,

obstructions and annoyance, danger to the human life and properties and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and tranquility. Hence, the Station House Officer, Odiansalai Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS, against the Counter Petitioner to not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human lives and properties, and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 11-03-2026 to appear for the hearing on 17-03-2026 and further hearing on 19-03-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Odiansalai Police Station, Puducherry. The notice for the Counter Petitioner was received by his mother, Tmt. Sivagami. The service was held sufficient for the Counter Petitioner.

7. During the course of enquiry on 19-03-2026, the Petitioner and the Counter Petitioner were present.

8. I have heard both the sides and carefully gone through all the available records in file placed by the Petitioner. In the Police Information Report / Petition, it is stated that the activities of the Counter Petitioner are in such a manner that he may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order, and public tranquility. There are various criminal cases were registered against him in various Police Stations. I have also heard the oral submissions of the Counter Petitioner. The Counter Petitioner has stated that the Petitioner has filed this false case with an ulterior motive.

9. Upon hearing both sides and on perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner, I am of the opinion that if the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like assault, damages to public and private properties, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order.

10. Hence, I, Dayanand Tendolkar, do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under the section 163(1) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Jayamoorthy @ Kabali (28), son of Manikandan, a resident of No. 21, Al Block, K.D. Thottam, Priyadharshini Nagar, Puducherry, from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of two months from the date of this order (in view of GEPLA -2026) or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry.

Hence, the Station House Officer, Odiansalai Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS, against the Counter Petitioner do not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human lives and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order.

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 11-03-2026 to appear for the hearing on 17-03-2026 and further hearing on 19-03-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Odiansalai Police Station, Puducherry. The notice was received by the Counter Petitioner.

7. During the course of enquiry on 19-03-2026, the Petitioner and the Counter Petitioner were present. The Ld. Counsel Mr. Gurumoorthy filed vakalath and represented on behalf of the Counter Petitioner.

8. I have heard both the sides and carefully gone through all the available records in file placed by the Petitioner. In the Police Information Report / Petition, it is stated that the activities of the Counter Petitioner are in such a manner that he may cause breach of peace and create a problem of law and order and public

tranquility. He has involved in crimes such as hurt, murder and disturbance to the public peace and order. There are various criminal cases were registered against him in various Police Stations. The Counter Petitioner further submitted that his male child first birthday is scheduled to be held on 28-03-2026 at the Uppalam area. Hence, he requested to attend his child birthday function on 28-03-2026 at the Uppalam area and prayed to drop the proceedings. In this regard, the Counter Petitioner has filed a written submission. I have also heard the oral and written submissions of the Counter Petitioner. The Counter Petitioner further stated that the Petitioner has filed this false case with an ulterior motive.

9. Upon hearing both sides and on perusal of the records submitted by the Petitioner, I am of the opinion that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside within the limits of my jurisdiction, the Counter Petitioner will continue to indulge in and also motivate serious offences like murder, assault, damages to public and private properties, obstructions, annoyance, *etc.*, and thereby become a perennial source of threat to the community and disturb public peace and order. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order.

10. Hence, I, Dayanand Tendolkar, do hereby, in the capacity of Subdivisional Magistrate (North), Puducherry, in exercise of powers conferred under the section 163(1) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), pass this order and prohibit the Counter Petitioner Thiru Gowsiga Balasubramanian @ Gowsi (30), son of Baskaran @ Kandasamy, a resident of No. 19, Lazar Koil Street, Duburayapet, Puducherry from entering into the region under the jurisdiction of the Subdivisional Magistrate Court (North), for a period of two months from the date of this order (in view of GEPLA - 2026) or till any further orders are passed by the Competent Authority revoking this prohibition as per law, whichever is earlier except when you are summoned to attend the cases in any of the Courts in Puducherry.

It is also stated that he is very active, dangerous, notorious element and therefore, his criminal activities cannot be prevented by invoking the mere security proceedings under the BNSS.

The Petitioner further submitted that if, the Counter Petitioner is allowed to reside in Puducherry region, it is apprehended that he would continue to indulge in serious offences like murder, assault, obstructions, annoyance, damages to public and private properties, etc., and thereby emerged as a perennial source of threat to

the community and disturb public peace and order. Hence, the Station House Officer, Kalapet Police Station, Puducherry, has prayed to invoke provisions under section 163 BNSS, against the Counter Petitioner not to enter into the jurisdiction of this Court for a period of two months as to prevent danger to the human life and properties and disturbance to the public tranquility and order;

6. The proceeding was started by affording an opportunity to the Counter Petitioner to show cause against the petition filed by the Petitioner. A notice was served to both the parties on 11-03-2026 to appear for the hearing on 17-03-2026. It was instructed to serve the notice to the Counter Petitioner through the Station House Officer, Kalapet Police Station, Puducherry. Such situations cannot be handled effectively by taking recourse to usual procedures contemplated by law and hence, it is necessary that special provision under section 163 of BNSS is invoked to take action against the Counter Petitioner to prevent harm to life and properties of citizens and uphold public peace and order;
